The timeline is projected as follows:

1. The high school district's budget draft, on state software formatted forms, will be presented as a handout at the June 8, 2004, Board meeting.
2. The budgets for both entities will be completed and provided in fully bound format at the June 17, 2004 special board meeting and available for full public inspection at that time.
3. A public hearing on the FY 2004-2005 budgets will be held at the June 22, 2004 board meeting and the board will be asked to take action.

The board must pass a final budget by June 30, 2004, and submit it to the Santa Barbara County Education Office no later than five days after adoption, or July 1, 2004, whichever occurs first.

Recommended: That the Board of Education review the budget information presented and provide staff with further direction on the development of the FY 2004-2005 budgets.

B.4 National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Systems Phase II Storm Water Management Plan*

Resource Person: David Hetyonk, Director of Facilities and Operations

8:45 p.m./10 mins.

In 1972, the Environmental Protection Agency passed the Clean Water Act. This act made it illegal to discharge any pollutants into the waters of the United States. The National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) designates the California State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) as the permitting authority for Waste Discharge Requirements for Storm Water Discharges from Non-traditional Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s). In California, the Santa Barbara School Districts are classified as MS4s. The SWRCB has further relegated enforcement authority and responsibility to the Regional Water Quality Control Boards (RWQCB). Phase I of the NPDES permit for large users was passed in 1990. Phase II of the NPDES was passed in 1999 and regulates small municipalities and includes school districts. The California State Water Resource Control Board passed a state wide general permit in 2003 that requires both districts to submit a Storm Water Management Plan for all district-owned sites by April 30, 2004.

Flowers and Associates and Dudek & Associates have assisted the district with the attached draft submittal of a single plan for both districts. District project managers and site principals were also an integral part of the planning process. The plan is now in a review period. The district can request modifications to the plan during the review process and any time after the plan is approved. If no changes are requested by the district, the state, or the public, the draft will become the final plan. The districts have until September 1, 2004, to submit any changes to the plan. The state is responsible for public and RWQCB comments. Future requirements are the submission of the applications and any requested district changes. Once the final plan is in place, staff may recommend the adoption of board policies and administrative regulations concerning storm water management.

C.1 El Puente Community School Memo of Understanding*

El Puente Community School serves students from the Santa Barbara High School District who have been expelled or have been placed at the school by the courts. For the past two years, the high school district has paid the Santa Barbara County Office of Education (SBCEO) an annual fee to help offset El Puente's facilities costs, which are quite high. The SBCEO is again requesting financial assistance from the high school district, which is outlined in the attached letter. Also attached is a memo of understanding. The cost is \$35,000 and will be funded through the use of school safety grant monies.

Recommendation: That the Board of Education approve the memo of understanding between the Santa Barbara High School District and the Santa Barbara County Office of Education for funding in the amount of \$35,000 for El Puente Community School

C.2 Approval of the Fighting Back Youth Service Program Contract*

Resource Person: Michael Couch, Assistant Superintendent of Secondary Education 9:05 p.m./15 mins.

The Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse's Fighting Back Youth Service Program provides a youth service specialist (yss) for each secondary campus. The district contributes \$185,172, a portion of the cost, each year to fund the youth service specialists. In 2004-2005, the district will fund its portion of the cost using \$126,553 from the state's School Safety and Violence Grant (AB 1113) and \$58,619 from Title 4 (TUPE/Tobacco Use Prevention Education). The Safe Schools/Healthy Students Grant, a federal grant, will pay the remainder of the costs for the youth service specialists and other programs without additional charges to the district or its categorical funds.

Recommended: That the Board of Education approve the Fighting Back Youth Service Program Contract in the amount of \$185,172 to provide youth service specialists to each secondary site.

- C.4 Required Public Hearing of Santa Barbara Teachers Association's Initial Proposal for Negotiations for the 2004-2005 School Year*

The Santa Barbara Teachers Association (SBTA) submitted their initial proposal for negotiations at the May 25, 2004, Board of Education meeting. In accordance with collective bargaining laws under which the districts negotiate with their employees, the districts are required to receive an initial proposal at a public meeting and subsequently conduct a public hearing on the initial proposal. A scheduled public hearing is being conducted as part of this agenda to provide an opportunity for any member of the public to comment regarding the initial proposal presented by the SBTA.

In keeping with the guidelines of the Public Employment Relations Board, the notice of receipt of this proposal has been officially posted. In addition, copies of the proposal were placed at the reference desks of the Santa Barbara and Goleta public libraries.

- C.5 Special Education – 2003-2004 Administrative Structure*
Resource Person: Deborah A. Flores, Ph.D., Superintendent 9:40 p.m./15 mins.

During the 2003-2004 school year, the administrative structure for the special education department included: interim special education director (part-time, 2-3 days per week); elementary special education coordinator (part-time, 80%); secondary special education coordinator (full time). This structure was created due to the fact that the district was unable to fill the position of special education director on a full-time basis. Dr. Walter Olsen agreed to fill in as an interim director until a full time director could be found. Unfortunately, previous recruitments were not successful. Fortunately for the district, Dr. Olsen has continued in the interim role the entire school year. Recently, a number of qualified candidates were found and a new special education director, Jeffrey Gabrielson, was hired.

The proposed structure for the 2004-2005 school year is as follows: special education director (full time) and special education coordinator (full time). Further information is provided in the attached report about the special education administrative structure during recent years. The report includes a cost comparison between the current school year (2003-2004) and the upcoming school year (2004-2005).

Recommended: That the Board of Education approve the proposed special education administrative structure for the 2004-2005 school year.

- C.6 Transfer of an Assistant Principal to La Cuesta Continuation High School

Funding for an assistant principal for La Cuesta Continuation High School is now available through state funding the district receives for continuation programs. This position will assist Kathy Abney, principal, in meeting the needs of La Cuesta's multiple programs at various sites. Bonnie Switack, currently an assistant principal at Santa Barbara Junior High School, has

expressed an interest in this assignment and is being voluntarily moved to La Cuesta Continuation High School. Mrs. Switack's salary will be \$90,348 (total cost of \$108,702 includes salary and health and fringe benefits).

C.7 Appointment of an Assistant Principal to Santa Barbara Junior High School

With the transfer of Bonnie Switack to La Cuesta Continuation High School, Santa Barbara Junior High School has an assistant principal vacancy. John Becchio, currently an administrative intern at Goleta Valley and La Colina Junior High Schools is being appointed to the vacant position at Santa Barbara Junior High School. The district has employed Mr. Becchio since August 1999. Prior to his appointment as an administrative intern, Mr. Becchio was a teacher at Santa Barbara Junior High School. Mr. Becchio's salary will be \$73,299 (total cost of \$89,455 includes salary and health and fringe benefits).

Recommended: That the Board of Education approve the appointment of John Becchio to the vacant assistant principal position at Santa Barbara Junior High School.

A funding contract for 2004-2005 with Santa Barbara County's United Way provides \$10,000 as follows: \$5,000 towards summer pre-kindergarten classes (for educational materials for enrolled students and for one teacher) and \$5,000 towards educational materials for school readiness Homeplay Learning Kits lent and given through Child Development and Healthy Start programs. The Healthy Start/A-OK director coordinates with United Way on sponsor visibility and expenditures of funds.

D.6 Approval of Agreement Between the Regents of the University of California on Behalf of the Gevirtz Graduate School of Education and the Gevirtz Research Center at the Santa Barbara Campus and the Santa Barbara School Districts for the Gevirtz Youth Enrichment Adventure Program*

The Gevirtz Research Center has received funding from The Whittier Family Foundations to develop, implement, and research an innovative summer enrichment program, called Youth Enrichment Adventure (YEA), in cooperation with the Elings Park Foundation. The overarching purpose of YEA is to improve academic achievement in the areas of science, math, language arts, and technology by developing a meaningful outdoor education program based in informal settings such as parks, gardens, nature preserves, and museums. Teachers from Harding, Franklin, McKinley, Santa Barbara Junior High and La Cumbre, as well as other outdoor educators and science educators, will be working in a team-teaching environment for four weeks during the summer of 2004, with six groups of 20 students per group.

Recommended: That the Board of Education approve the agreement with the Gevirtz Research Center for the Gevirtz Youth Enrichment Adventure Program, beginning June 8, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005.

D.7 Approval of contracts with Family Service Agency of Santa Barbara to provide Healthy Start services at Adams, Cleveland, Franklin, Harding, and McKinley Elementary schools and for Child Development Program sites for 2004-2005*

A grant from the California Department of Education to the Santa Barbara Elementary School District, contracts from Santa Barbara County Department of Social Services and First 5 Santa Barbara County Children and Family Commission, and other categorical funds provide funding

1. Schools will meet the following accountability goals for student achievement:
 - a. No child Left Behind AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress) goals for all significant subgroups in the following areas:
 - (1) Participation Rate
 - (2) Percent of students proficient or above on the California Standards Test (elementary and junior high schools) and high school exit exam (high schools)
 - (3) Graduation rate improvement (high schools only)
 - b. State API (Academic Performance Index) targets as follows:
 - (1) Growth targets based on calculations using California Standards Test and CAT/6 performance
 - (2) Similar schools ranks of seven (7) or higher
2. Improve the delivery of educational services for learning disabled students in both regular and special education through early identification and intervention based on scientifically sound research, and implement performance-based methods for program evaluation.
3. Implement a master facilities plan to guide the use of facilities resources, including 1-98 and Measure V bond funds and real property assets, to provide housing for students and staff that will promote student achievement and learning. Critical facilities needs include relocation of the District Offices, expansion of the Santa Barbara Community Academy, and permanent housing for Open Alternative School and Santa Barbara Charter. Plans for meeting these critical facility needs will be developed by November 2004.
4. Enhance communication with, and outreach to parents and community members regarding district policies, individual school site programs, academic achievement, and successes within the District.
5. Seek to broaden the representation of diverse constituencies in the Santa Barbara School Districts' governance.
