Public Comments

Public comments are welcome. Speaker cards may be turned in at any time before an agenda item is called. When addressing the board, please use the microphone and state your name. Each speaker is limited to three minutes or less and the total time allowed for public comment on any one item is 20 minutes. The times may be altered depending upon the number of speakers. Speakers may not give time to other speakers. Written comments may also be submitted. Comments on regular agenda items are taken during consideration of the item. There is a separate opportunity for public comments on matters not on the agenda at the beginning of the regular session. The board of education is not responsible for the content of statements made during public comment.
