Instruction

EXTRACURRICULAR AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Extracurricular activities are not part of the regular school curriculum, and are not graded, do not offer credit and do not take place during classroom time. These activities are supervised or financed by the school district and student participation in these programs is not obligatory. Extracurricular activities include both preparations for performance and performance before an audience or spectators.

Co-curricular activities are programs that may be associated with the curriculum in a regular classroom where students earn credit and are graded.

The secondary schools in the Santa Barbara High School District are authorized to participate in all appropriate activities of the California Interscholastic Federation. The participation of any student or team representing a school shall be supervised and controlled by the building principal or his/her designee. The principal is responsible to insure that students participating in such activities meet the eligibility standards set forth in this regulation and AR5170.1. School principals will also supervise and control the participation of any team or group of students in any activity to include all aspects of the scheduling and conduct of such participation.

With approval of the Superintendent or his/her designee, the individual schools will be represented in the local league of the California Interscholastic Federation by the building principal or his/her designee. Whenever a designee for representation is used, consideration shall be given to naming a person from underrepresented groups. The school principal, under the supervision of the Superintendent or his/her designee, is responsible for all aspects of the school's participation in the activities of the California Interscholastic Federation. An annual report shall be made to the Board of Education about the CIF activities during the year.

The Superintendent or his/her designee will represent schools in league or other bodies of the California Interscholastic Federation.

The Board of Education shall receive notification of upcoming CIF meetings so that Board members may be able to address important issues and allow their recommendations to be considered at such meetings.

Each building principal will establish a procedure to insure that all students who participate in extracurricular activities sponsored by the school meet the following eligibility standards:

1. Citizenship

To participate, a student must maintain a 2.0 citizenship grade at each quarterly marking period.

2. Scholastic Eligibility

In order to represent a Santa Barbara District high school in extracurricular and co-curricular performances and/or competitions, a student must have earned an overall academic grade point average of 2.0 or higher the quarter immediately preceding that of participation.

Students under special circumstances or with undue hardship may, through the recommendation of their athletic or student activities instructor, submit a request for waiver of the 2.0 regulation to the principal.

All waiver requests will be referred to a SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY COMMITTEE of three or five people for consideration. The makeup of the SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY COMMITTEE will be established, and chaired, at each school by the building principal.

The name of and pertinent facts concerning any student who receives a recommendation for a waiver will be sent to the Superintendent or his/her designee for approval. Approval indicates eligibility with Academic Probation for the quarter. The terms of probation shall be such that if a subsequent four-week check of their progress does not indicate substantial progress towards the attainment of a 2.0 grade point average, that student will be declared ineligible for the remainder of the quarter.

3. Attendance

A student must be in full attendance on the day of the activity in which he/she is participating.

4. Unit Requirement

A student must be making normal progress toward graduation according to the following chart:
