



Road to Renovation

Measure I-98

An update on the Santa Barbara Elementary School District's modernization & renovation projects made possible by bond Measure I-98.

1999-2000 School Year

- July 26, 2000: Half of the Districts' administration office was renovated to accommodate a new school, permitting the Santa Barbara Community Academy to move into its new location.
- Spring 2000: A committee was formed to develop recommendations to the Board of Education about Open Alternative School and Santa Barbara Charter School housing options.
- Two architectural firms and the Districts' staff worked on designs and submitted required paperwork to the Division of State Architect.

Summer 2000

- Roofs were replaced at Peabody Charter and Monroe Elementary.
- Temporary portables were placed on Peabody Charter and Monroe so that multi-phase classroom renovations could be completed during the 2000-2001 school year.

2000-2001 School Year

- Portables on the lower half of the Cleveland Elementary campus will be replaced and reorganized and a new bathroom facility will be installed.
- Peabody Charter and Monroe Elementary will have extensive interior renovations and infrastructure upgrades.
- Child Development portables at Franklin Elementary will be replaced and reorganized.
- New and replacement portables will be installed at Franklin Elementary (2) and Monroe Elementary (1).
- Architects will continue to work on the designs and State approvals needed to effect improvements at Peabody Charter, Adams, Franklin, McKinley, and Washington Elementary Schools.

2000-2001 and 2001-2002 School Years

- New libraries will be constructed at: Adams, Franklin, Peabody Charter, and Washington Elementary Schools
- A roof replacement will be done at Adams Elementary and roof repair will be completed at McKinley Elementary School.
- New permanent classrooms will be constructed at Franklin Elementary School.
- Portables will be replaced and reorganized at Peabody Charter, McKinley, and Washington Elementary Schools.
