



OPEN ENROLLMENT INFORMATION LETTER TO PARENTS

Dear Parents/Guardians:

On January 26, 1994, The Board of Education adopted into policy and administrative regulations the Open Enrollment legislation (AB1114), passed into California law in 1993. Implementation of the policy began with the 1994-1995 school year, and the policy and administrative regulations were revised in December 2005.

Residency for attendance in a school in the Santa Barbara Elementary/High School Districts is determined in accordance with the attached Board Policy and Administrative Regulations.

THE SANTA BARBARA ELEMENTARY DISTRICT operates thirteen (13) schools under the following configurations:

The District offers self-contained GATE classrooms at Washington School (grades 3-6). The District offers cluster GATE programs at each of the other schools. Identified GATE students may attend either program as space is available.

An English Language Development Program is provided at all schools for Limited English Proficient students. Special Education programs and services for disabled students are available at all school sites. Parents interested in these services should contact the Special Education office at the District.

Parents are encouraged to contact the schools directly regarding additional information relating to program offerings.

THE SANTA BARBARA HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT operates seven regular schools and a continuation high school program at two sites under the following configurations:

The junior high/middle schools and the comprehensive high schools offer the same basic core curriculum at their respective levels. Specific class offerings, particularly in the elective programs may vary somewhat among the schools. Parents/guardians are requested to contact schools directly with respect to specific class offerings. Regional Occupation Classes are offered to students sixteen years of age and older with a variety of classes offered at different school and community locations throughout the District. There are no special enrollment procedures for any of the comprehensive secondary schools. GATE and Special Education programs are offered at all schools for students who qualify for those programs.
